

The Arctic Sunrise Appeal

In September 2013, the Greenpeace ship Arctic Sunrise was illegally boarded and impounded by Russian commandos. Held for almost a year, it has since been returned but needs an extensive refit to enable it to continue to operate in the challenging conditions of the Arctic. The appeal aims to raise the funds to restore the ship allowing it to carry on protecting the Arctic for all of us.

The works of Krys Leach and Tracy Myers displayed in **Melt** were produced in response to their own polar exploration in 2009 and the beauty of the remote landscapes they experienced. They were fascinated by man's battle with this inhospitable realm and were drawn to the decaying structures and textures of the abandoned whaling stations at Grytviken on South Georgia and at Deception Island on the Antarctic Peninsula.

As a draughtswoman, printmaker, photographer and designer, Tracy combines various techniques and uses digital manipulation to produce her images. The collagraphs are printed in her studio in very small editions, on Somerset 300gsm paper.

Krys creates luscious snowscapes and ingenious 3D interpretations of the abandoned whaling stations He layers oil paint over acrylic, adding marble dust, carborundum and objets trouvés.
